TEACHING LEARNING METHOD OPTED BY THE DEPARTMENT OF HISTORY.

- From 2018 to 2023 our Department has focused on class room teaching where we encourage our students to seek clarification from teachers at the end of the lecture if they face any difficulties or problems. Classroom teaching is the most basic form of teaching where student interaction, problem solving skills, inter personal skills can be facilitated by the Teacher. Teachers can also provide individualized attention to those students who may need additional support or guidance.
- During the pandemic (2019-2020 2020-2021), the classes were conducted via Google Meet. Classes were taken regularly according to the routine prepared. Presentation, assessment and online evaluation were conducted. Google classroom provides a centralized hub for resources, assignments and discussions. A variety of content was shared like documents, PPTs, PDFs, etc. Assignments are distributed through instructions, due dates and resources. Google classrooms fostering a more interactive and engaging learning experience that boost-up the confidence level of students.
- Various methods were adopted for occasional interaction with the students during the pandemic. A quiz contest was organised, the students organised Jash-i-ilahi a cultural competition, and group presentations were held to foster a pragmatic learning environment

online. Post pandemic, normal activities were resumed. Class presentation, Heritage walk, Tours etc were organised as to make teaching learning process more interesting. Chalk and talk have been the constant method of teaching learning. Teachers also resort to power point presentations to provide a more visual experience to the students.

• The department has also focused on field-based study. The students visit the State Archives and participate in the lectures organised by the Archives. This allows the students to understand the subject better.
