About the College

Heramba Chandra College, a premier coeducational institution popularly known as South City Day College, is situated in Golpark, the cultural hub of South Kolkata. With a long and glorious history, the college is surrounded by a lush green lawn adorned with colourful flowers and plants, creating an eco-friendly atmosphere conducive to mental growth and openness of mind.

In the history of our nation, City College is remembered not only for its pioneering efforts in the field of education but also as an embodiment of the liberal spirit that enriched the nineteenth-century Renaissance in India. A genuine humanistic approach to education is practised here, fostering a warm and friendly relationship between teachers and students. This age-old tradition of a nurturing student-teacher relationship is a rich legacy handed down by the founders of this group of colleges. The college celebrated its golden jubilee with great fervour in 2006.

City College began modestly as City School, founded on January 6, 1879, by the Sadharan Brahmo Samai. The initial expenses were borne by Late Ananda Mohan Bose, the then President of the Samai. along contributions from Late Sivanath Sastri and other prominent members. In 1881, just two years after its establishment, the City School was elevated to a college with the introduction of F.A. classes. The college quickly advanced, opening a B.A. course in 1884, and within five years, it became a first-grade college. In January 1905, City College was placed under the control of "The City College Institution," a society registered under Act XXI of 1860, known as the Brahma Samaj Education Society.

Currently, the college is government-aided, having been taken over from the Brahmo Samaj. The Commerce Department of City College was started in 1939 to address the practical and vital needs of the time, training

personnel for leadership in industry and commerce. Due to the prevailing disturbances. it was decided to provide education in a safe zone for students of South Calcutta, leading to the establishment of an institution in November 1946 at Lansdowne Road. In July 1952, the institution moved to 50 Mahim Halder Street, Kalighat, Late Horendra Coomer Mukheriee, the then Governor of West Bengal, laid the foundation stone of the present South Calcutta Building on January 6. 1954, with the opening ceremony held on January 6, 1955, On June 1, 1961, the South City College Branch of City College branched off into three separate colleges: Sivanath Sastri College (Morning), Heramba Chandra College and Prafulla Chandra College (Evening). Thus, Heramba Chandra College was born.

The college continues to excel in academics as well as in sports, earning a B+ rating from the NAAC Peer Team in the second cycle of accreditation in 2016. It offers 4-year Honours/Honours with Research courses in Commerce, Bangla, Economics, Education, English, Geography, History, Political Science, and a Multidisciplinary Course in Commerce. can also take Statistics Mathematics as Minor and Interdisciplinary subjects. For over 60 years, the college has earned a reputation as one of the leading colleges in South Kolkata. Committed to the allround development of students, the college organises regular departmental excursions and excels in sports, with students winning several trophies both individually and in groups. Social upliftment programmes are also a significant focus, with initiatives like the St. John Ambulance, Campus Harmony and Social Service Unit, and Ramdhanu (an initiative for underprivileged children of the locality) providing humanitarian support.

Code of Conduct for the Students

Heramba Chandra College places a strong emphasis on instilling a sense of responsibility and discipline in its students, recognizing their integral role in the teaching-learning process. The College upholds a well-defined Code of Conduct that extends beyond the campus, aiming to mould students into morally and socially responsible citizens at both national and global levels. Adherence to the Code of Conduct is mandatory for all students, ensuring the maintenance of strict discipline within the college and fostering an academic environment conducive to growth. The key aspects of the Code of Conduct include the following.

- 1. Students are expected to display reverence for the National Heritage, National Flag, and National Song, promoting a sense of patriotism.
- A respectful demeanour towards the Principal, teachers, non-teaching staff, and fellow students is imperative. Abusive language or behaviour that dishonour the institution is strictly prohibited.
- 3. Students are required to adhere to the attendance rules stipulated by the University of Calcutta, attending classes regularly and punctually.
- 4. Active engagement in outreach programmes, extracurricular activities and sports is encouraged.
- Smoking and drinking within the college campus are strictly prohibited, contributing to a healthy and focused academic atmosphere.
- Carrying the issued identity card within the college premises is mandatory, serving as proof of the student's status and containing essential information.
- 7. Any form of ragging is strictly prohibited, in line with UGC guidelines. Students must submit an anti-ragging declaration, and incidents should be promptly reported to the Anti-Ragging Cell.
- Students are responsible for maintaining cleanliness on the campus, including toilets. The
 college is a plastic-free zone, and any littering is subject to fines determined by the
 administration.
- 9. Discrimination based on caste, creed, or religion is intolerable.
- 10. Abiding by the rules and regulations of the College Library, as detailed in the prospectus, is mandatory.
- 11. Students must handle college property, including furniture, laboratory equipment and library books, with utmost care.
- 12. Decent dressing within the college campus is desirable.
- 13. Cell phones and electronic gadgets are not allowed during class lectures, practical classes, and are strictly prohibited in the examination hall.
- 14. Students are responsible for the safety of their personal belongings.

- 16. The college campus is under CCTV surveillance, underscoring the importance of maintaining a secure and accountable environment.





Academic Advancements

- 1. Honours Graduates of all streams and subjects are eligible to join Post Graduate Courses, run by the University in different subjects. They may also join Post Graduate Courses of other Universities. For example- Commerce Graduates may join M.Com. Course. Apart from M.A. in the subject concerned, English Honours graduates may join M.A. in Mass Communication, History Honours graduates can join M.A. in Museology, Archaeology, Geography Honours graduates may join course in GIS, Political Science Honours graduates and Education Honours graduates can join M.A. in Sociology, Economics Honours graduate may opt for International Trade or Foreign Trade courses taught by JNU or MSOE course offered by ISI.
- All graduates, pass or Honours, are eligible for postgraduate courses in management. Commerce and Economics Honours students usually have an edge in financial management.
- 3. Though students of all disciplines can pursue Chartered Accountancy and/or Cost Accountancy Courses, Commerce students are definitely more inclined to such courses.
- 4. M.A. in rural development and M.A. in social welfare are other courses, which may be pursued by graduates from any social science subject.

Career Prospects

- 1. Campus interviews are arranged regularly for the students. The reputed companies like TCS, Bajaj Alliance, iPAC, Accenture etc. recruit a considerable number of students every year.
- 2. Students may contact Dr Ayanagshu Sarkar in this regard.
- All students graduated from our college are eligible to sit for different competitive examinations like UPSC, PSC, (Civil Services, and Miscellaneous Services) Banking Services etc.
- 4. Though all graduates are eligible to sit for School Service Commission Examinations, scope is enormous for Bangla, English, History and Geography. In this field, there is very limited scope for Commerce and Economics.
- 5. For Commerce graduates West Bengal Audit and Accounts service is a very good option.
- For Economics Honours graduates, there are special options for Indian Economic Services and Indian Statistical Services, Statistical Investigators (NSSO/CSO)
- 7. Journalism is another career option for graduates (Specially for Bengali and English Honours graduates)
- 8. Bengali and English Honours students can join publication industry.
- 9. Bengali and English Honours students can join the Film or Tele industry as script writer.

Add-on or Value-added or Certificate Courses

In the current academic year, several add-on or value-added or certificate courses are offered to the students of the college. These courses are strategically designed keeping in mind the academic need and to enhance the academic experience and skill set of students, aligning with the evolving demands of the professional landscape. Through these initiatives, the college aims to further enrich the educational journey of its students and empower them with relevant knowledge and competencies for their future endeavours.

Library

The Library has two parts: (i) Heramba Chandra College Central Library, and (ii) Heramba Chandra College Seminar Library. Both of the Libraries are equipped with a diversified collection of subject-based resources including the acquisition of ~40,000 books with their various updated ramifications to meet the quest for knowledge of their uses. They meet the demands of the students of B.A., B.Sc. and B.Com.; the teachers and other staff-members of the College. In addition, Geography Departmental Library is also there in the College.

The Central Library is on the third floor in the college building with an area of 282.31 sq.mt. Reading facility is available in the Central Library with the seating capacity of 70 persons at a time. The Central Library for all three Colleges has been filled with rare books since the inception of these three colleges. The Seminar Library has an area of 45.62 sq.mt. situated at the ground floor in the college building. The users may enroll themselves as the members in both the Libraries for borrowing books, availing reading facility etc. Library resources are maintained under both open and closed access.



- 1. The students have to produce library cards to avail the library services.
- 2. The students can be issued 3 Library Cards. 2 cards are for borrowing books and 1 card is for availing reading facility. The issued cards are not transferable.
- 3. Library Cards are issued to the students after 2-3 working days on submission of 3 copies of Acknowledgement Receipt of 1st Semester Admission (1-paged print out) and 3 copies of stamp-size colour photograph.
- 4. Library Cards are valid for 3/4 academic years from the admission of the student in the College.
- 5. 2 books (1 book from Central Library, 1 book from Seminar Library) can be borrowed at a time by the students as home issue for 1 month from the Library, provided the previously issued books are returned/renewed in time.

- 9. The fine would be calculated @INR 1/- per book per day (for a Student) and will be counted from the next day of the "Due Date".
- 10. Loss of Card should be reported immediately, the original holder is responsible for any misuse of the lost card.

- 11. Unauthorized persons shall have no access to the Library.
- 12. Conversation, waiting, food-intake etc. are not allowed in the Library. Users are not permitted with their personal belongings in the stack and/or reading area.
- 13. The borrowed books must not be damaged or disfigured in any way. Borrowers should notify all damages found in the books at the time of issue. Otherwise they will be responsible for any damage that may be found at the time of return.
- 14. In case of loss or damage of books issued, the borrower will have to replace the same books of the latest edition.
- 15. Renewal of a book is only possible if multiple copies of it are available in the Library, or there is no demand for the book by other members of the Library.
- 16. Reading facility is only available in the Central Library. Books are not to be passed on to other readers.
- 17. Library Clearance has to be taken for release from the College.
- 18. The Library remains open during summer recess (16th May to 30th June).






Campus Harmony and Social Service Unit




Ramdhanu: An Extension Initiative
