  Graduates should be capable of identifying complex issues, analysing root causes, and
  proposing effective solutions. This skill is valuable in both personal life and
  professional careers.
- 2. **Research Skills.** This BA programme requires students to engage in research activities. They should learn to use proper research methodologies and tools to investigate and present their findings.

Depending on their chosen major, minor and interdisciplinary subjects within the BA programme, students should develop expertise in their specific area of study, whether it's literature, history, education, economics, geography, political science, or another field.
