Koha supports multilingual-indexing, full-text searching, metadata interoperability using Library Standards and Protocols, platform-independent interfaces etc. A framework (customized MARC21) is tested and built up for the standardization process in cataloguing and metadata digitization with authorized values. ILMS has 6328 unique titles with 18727 items/copies under digitization process of resource metadata. Web-OPAC (link: <https://hcc.blacal.in>) is available through a global API enabling the retrieval of resource metadata validating field-based search and advanced search along with content description against each title leading to keyword-indexing. The circulation work with inclusion of Patron databases is going on. Multi-lingual data are entered in language-specific script and/or roman script as per the necessity of searching. The barcodes, generated in label batches, are being printed and attached to the physical resources leading to an automated process in circulation to facilitate the library users.

Proper utilization of funds allocated by the Governing Body is distributed among various departments through the meeting of the Library Sub-Committee for the purchasing of books or subscribing e-resources. The library promotes open access to the learners, the usage is monitored under cctv surveillance. The 24x7x365 Web-OPAC service (global access) is maintained by the Bengal Library Association through a MoU. An internal centralized system has been initiated to overcome the previous complexity of maintaining purchasing records for the central library and seminar library, though the accessioning work is done keeping similarity in documentation minimizing parallelism. A cumulative datasheet is being prepared mapping- purchase records of the library, payment records of the accounts and accession records of the library. Finance Committee and Tender Committee decides the budget, purchase and maintenance of various assets. Purchases and/or maintenance are controlled through various heads such as Maintenance (general), Maintenance Hardware, Maintenance Software, Stationeries, Website Maintenance, Cloud Rental etc. As three colleges [Sivanath Sastri College (Morning), Heramba Chandra College (Day), Prafulla Chandra College (Evening)] utilizes the same college building and allied premises in three shifts, there is a South City College Coordination Committee to decide the procedure of maintaining and utilizing different infrastructural facilities including classrooms and others.

7.3 - Institutional Distinctiveness

7.3.1 - Portray the performance of the Institution in one area distinctive to its priority and thrust within 200 words

One of the distinctive qualities of Heramba Chandra College is its academic excellence which has been maintained for a long time and even during post pandemic times, when enabling the students to return to offline mode of examination has been a big challenge. But we have overcome this challenge in flying colours. In 2021-22, 754 students appeared in the final semester examination, out of which 722 (95.7%) passed the examination. In the academic session 2022-23, the percentage is 93.3. Every year several of our students get placed. Private organisations are eager to recruit our graduates.

The departments collaborated with the administration to assert all pre-pandemic norms and practices and disciplines seriously as soon as the college reopened. While hybrid mode is used for teaching, all internal examinations have been held in offline mode since the reopening of college after the pandemic. In the last three academic years not less than 60 seminars, webinars, workshops and special lectures were held (in some cases, with the sponsorship of ICSSR) which continue to benefit our students, particularly the advanced learners. The teachers mentor the slow learners, sometimes talk to their parents, use ICT in classrooms to make the classroom attractive and reassert the value that 'Knowledge is power'.
